Before all of that, while I was thinking about the Erasmus, I had some options of places where I could go but from the beginning I was sure that I wanted to come to Finland. During my stay here, many people asked me lots of times why I've chosen Finland if it is a very cold country and there is nothing to do here in winter.

I wanted a place which is different from my home city, somewhere that I was not used to, I wanted to feel that everything was new for me.

Finnish people are used to that cold weather and bored of it, but instead for me it has been amazing going out every morning and see all the street full of snow, being at that low temperature and realize that I can be there and everything is fine.
